## Overview of Itinerary



**Boston Common** is a central public park in downtown Boston, Massachusetts. Dating from 1634, it is the oldest city park in the United States. The **Public Garden** is a large park in the heart of Boston, Massachusetts.



**Cheers** Beacon Hill is a tourist classic bar located on Beacon St in Beacon Hill neighborhood of Boston Massachusetts. Best known internationally as the exterior of the bar seen in the hit NBC sitcom "Cheers".



**Massachusetts State House** is the capitol and seat of government for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.



**Boston City Hall** in Massachusetts It includes the seat of city government of Boston office of the Mayor of Boston



**Boston Harbor** is a natural harbor located adjacent to the city of Boston Massachusetts. It is home to the Port of Boston, a major shipping facility in the northeastern United States.

**Old Granary & King's Chapel Burying Ground** is the city third oldest cemetery founded in 1660, located on Tremont St. Boston. Final resting place for many Revolutionary War era patriots, Paul Revere, Samuel Adams and John Hancock.

**The Old State House** built in 1713 was the seat of Massachusetts General Court until 1798 and is one of the oldest public buildings.

**The New England Aquarium** located in Boston Ma. Attractions include the Simons [IMAX](#) Theatre and the Whale Watch, which operates from April thru November. The aquarium has more than 22,000 members and hosts more than 1.3 million visitors each year

**Boston Children's Museum** is the second oldest and one of the most influential children's museums in the world. Founded in 1913. Museum exhibits focus on science, culture, environmental awareness and the arts.

**Faneuil Hall Marketplace**  
Over 70 retailers and 40 offices. 160,000 square feet of space for festivals, restaurants, pubs and the world-famous Quincy Market Colonnade.

**Boston Tea Party Museum**  
American History by interactive exhibits. See the full-scale vessels, artifacts.

**King's Chapel Burying Ground** is the oldest cemetery in the city and is a site on the Freedom Trail Founded in 1630. There are 505 headstones and 59 footstones remaining from the more than 1000 people buried in the small space since its inception.

**The Old South Meeting House** is a historic Congregational church building built in 1729. It gained fame as the organizing point for the Boston Tea Party on December 16, 1773.

The **Paul Revere House** (1680) home of American patriot Paul Revere during the time of the American Revolution. Located at 19 North Square Boston, Ma in the city's North End.

The **USS Constitution Museum** located in the Charlestown Navy Yard, which is part of the Boston National Historical Park in Boston, Massachusetts. The museum is situated near the ship *USS Constitution* at the end of Boston's Freedom Trail.

**Bunker Hill Monument** The Bunker Hill Monument was erected to commemorate the Battle of Bunker Hill, which was among the first major battles between British and Patriot forces in the American Revolutionary War, fought there June 17, 1775

**Trinity Church** Grand Episcopal church built in 1877, featuring notable stained-glass windows

**Boston Public Library** Founded in 1848 as the first publicly funded lending library in the country

**Isabella Steward Gardner Museum** 2500-piece collection of paintings, sculptures, furniture, tapestries, decorative arts, books

**Fenway Park** America's Most Beloved Ballpark home of the Boston Red Sox

**Boston Pops & Symphony Orchestra** at Symphony Hall , the highlight of a trip is a Pops concert, either in Symphony Hall or at the Hatch Memorial Shell

**Museum of Fine Arts Boston** The Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, Massachusetts, is the fifth largest museum in the United States. It contains more than 450,000 works of art, making it one of the most comprehensive collections in the Americas

**Prudential Center** a 32-acre complex of apartments, shops, restaurants, and a 52-story tower. On its 50th floor you can visit the Skywalk observation deck for 360-degree views of Boston and its surroundings.
